Warwickshire Freemasons

11,000 babies are born across Heartlands and **Good Hope** Hospitals every year and every year, 1,000 of these babies will arrive earlier than expected and therefore need urgent, lifesaving care in our specialist **Neonatal Units.**



In 2019, The Provincial Grand Lodge of Warwickshire enabled us to purchase two specialist incubators after donating an amazing £40,000. They haven't stopped there; we are pleased to announce they have donated a staggering £20,000 to fund a whole year of free accommodation at our Heartlands Home away from Home, so that families with premature babies receiving lifesaving treatment on the Neonatal Unit can be just a few minutes' walk from their loved ones.

Brett hosts the annual football matches with his family and friends in memory of his dad, Michael, who was treated at Heartlands Hospital for kidney failure and sadly passed away in 2016. Brett wanted to thank the incredible team who provided such amazing care and worked so hard to keep his dad alive for as long



as possible. Brett said, "The staff and care at Heartlands Hospital were second to none; they saved my dad's life and gave us more precious time to spend with him. A special thanks to Tracie and her team for keeping dad going for another few months."

Since Brett started the annual football matches in 2016, he has raised over £3,200 for the Renal Unit at Heartlands Hospital to help fund vital equipment, allowing families to have more precious time with their loved ones, like his family. Brett's fundraising isn't slowing down and he is already talking about next year's match! He said, "It's the same lads every year, 28 of us. We play 11-a-side for 90 minutes and we'll keep doing it for as long as we can."

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Guru Nanak Ladies



The Guru Nanak Nam Ladies, a Sikh women's group, have raised an incredible £18,500 to support appeals at Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham over the years.

Their steadfast support has raised money for our Eye Appeal, Skin Cancer Appeal, Dignity in Care for Dementia patients and most recently they donated £6,500 to our Breast Cancer Appeal.

Thanks to the ladies, we were able to purchase a Sentinel Lymph Node Biopsy machine. This lifesaving piece of equipment helps doctors estimate the risk of tumour cells being able to spread to other parts of the body. If the sentinel node is negative for cancer, a patient may be able to avoid more extensive

lymph node surgery, reducing the potential complications associated with having many lymph nodes removed. We are tremendously grateful to the Guru Nanak Nam Ladies for their continued support as they help us change and save lives across our hospitals.

Charlotte and Nicola

We would like to thank Charlotte Harris for her donation to UHB Charity in support of her dear friend Nicola Chancellor. Nicola has congenital heart disease and, at 47, suffered heart failure and nearly died four times while in hospital. She was at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Birmingham for five months when she finally received a heart transplant last year. Her best friend Charlotte and her husband visited her many times during her treatment in hospital and decided to fundraise for the Transplant Team by asking for donations instead of receiving Christmas presents last year. They managed to raise



over £1,000! Charlotte said, "This is our way of saying thank you to the Transplant Team for what they have done for our amazing friend and giving us the best Christmas present EVER – the gift of life!"

Huge support for Fisher House UK as it celebrates 10

We are thrilled that Fisher House UK, which is entirely charity funded, has reached the incredible 10th anniversary milestone on the Queen Elizabeth Hospital site in Birmingham. Our Home away from Home offers accommodation for military personnel and their families in their time of need.

To mark the occasion, we hosted a celebration to say thank you to all the incredible supporters we've had over the years; from those who helped build it in 2013, like Fisher House Foundation, Help For Heroes and SSAFA, the Armed Forces Charity, to the community of armed forces organisations

that continue to support Fisher House, including amongst others: Royal Navy and Royal Marines Charity, RAF Benevolent Fund, ABF The Soldiers' Charity and Royal British Legion. The Royal British Legion is also donating an incredible £150,000 to help keep Fisher House open. This fantastic donation of £50,000 a year for the next three years will help keep military families together when the unthinkable happens.

We'd like to highlight the incredible staff on the Major Trauma Unit, who treat military patients when they are flown

in, as well as all the wards and departments at University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust who support them with other treatments. We'd also like to thank the families themselves, the Fisher House staff team and those who have donated and raised funds. Without them all, we wouldn't be able to support our families and we are determined to be here for many more families for years to come.

years of helping military personnel and their families.



Fisher House first opened its doors ten years ago and my family and I were one of the very first to stay. In February 2013, my wife got that dreaded knock at the door. I was severely injured in an IED explosion whilst on my fourth deployment in Afghanistan. The explosion resulted in the immediate loss of my left leg and seriously damaged my right arm and leg. I was quickly flown to Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham where I took the difficult decision to also have my right leg amputated.

My world had turned upside down. My family live across the country and rushed to be by my side. With my jaw being wired shut, I was desperate to show my wife that I was ok and see that she was ok.

Thankfully, they were able to stay at Fisher House, just five minutes from the hospital, and visit whenever they wanted. I wouldn't have gotten through my injury without my family. I can't thank Fisher House enough for looking after them so well.



"During those difficult early days of my recovery, Fisher House gave me and my family a place to escape. It was our sanctuary, our bubble, our safe haven."



My wife would come to the hospital and push me over to Fisher House in my wheelchair. The house allowed us to have space, away from the hospital, to try and wrap our heads round our new life and come to terms with my injuries. I was able to play with my little boy in a place that felt like a real home. My mates in the military were also able to visit and helped me piece together my memories surrounding the attack to try and work past it.



Family is everything to me; knowing that they were safe in Fisher House and being looked after, allowed me to focus on my recovery. The highlight of my days would be my little boy coming over from Fisher House for cuddles on my hospital bed.



This is my story. But there have been thousands of military families over the last 10 years with their own stories and Fisher House has been there through it all. I know all of us want to say a huge thank you for their support when the worst happens. We need to make sure Fisher House is there for other families in the future.



We are also going to reinvigorate the Children's Physiotherapy wards at Good Hope and Heartlands Hospitals, creating more appropriate spaces for staff to assess their young patients' progression, whilst making it more engaging and fun for the patients during their multiple check-ups.

with Jayne Ruisi, YPU Specialist Teacher



In partnership with the James Brindley School, UHB Charity funds a specialist teacher, Jayne Ruisi, to support our young people with cancer with their education and development whilst they receive lifesaving treatment.

How does your role support young people on the Young **Person's Cancer Unit at Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham?** Last year, I supported over 820

young cancer patients aged 16-24 whilst they underwent treatment. This can range from bedside teaching of GCSE's and A-Levels, helping them write

their university applications, securing apprentices, navigating student finance... the list goes on! I take a holistic and tailored approach to all my students to help guide them through their future education or careers. It is so important for them to know that their cancer diagnosis doesn't have to stop their dreams and ambitions; and I'm there to support them with whatever they need.

What is the best part of your job?

The best part of my job is seeing young people, going through the toughest experiences of their lives, achieving things they didn't think they could. They don't let cancer hold them back and it is my privilege to teach them. I love the fact that I can support these young patients during their treatment journey and hopefully make a difference. It's a fantastic job.

What have you seen your students go on to achieve when they finish treatment?

I have seen countless patients go on to fulfil lifelong ambitions. I have had students complete

their Masters degrees, gain apprenticeships with FTSE100 companies and even become doctors themselves. I am proud of each and every one of them.

Why is it so important UHB Charity is able to continue to fund your role?

It is truly life-changing for these young people. Being able to continue their education and pursue their dreams gives them something to aim for and reassures them their future is not going to be damaged by their diagnosis. The support funded by UHB Charity, allows them to stay on track and takes the pressure off them and their families at what is already a very difficult time.

It costs £40 to provide a family with one night's accommodation. The Red Arrows Trust's donation of £5,000 will help to provide 125 nights' of accommodation for military families in need.

Fisher House provides comfort for families during a traumatic period of their lives. A guest said that the "kindness and support" he received from the Fisher House staff "made a difficult journey easier." Similarly, another guest said she was thankful for Fisher House as it gave her the chance to "stay next to [her husband] without having the worry of driving back home."

CHRISTMAS CHOIRS



Work has begun on the new 'Edmonds Transplant Centre', as it will be known, which will become a national centre of excellence for organ transplantation in Birmingham.

To mark its 150th anniversary, A Edmonds & Co Ltd is delighted to be partnering with UHB Charity to help develop the Transplant Centre for patients going through lifesaving treatment at Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham.

Anna said, "Aunt Kara was like a second mother to me; she was always around to help my husband and I with the children, taking them out for visits to the park and spoiling them rotten. She also knew just how much time I spent at Solihull Hospital with Arthur, my son.

"Arthur has a number of health challenges, which means we probably have ten to twelve appointments at Solihull Hospital every year for tests, injections and examinations. The staff are amazing, but the Children's Department was always a bit drab and bleak.


